

The Shed is located in Warroad Minnesota. I have it on my list of car museums to visit, Swanks have talked about touring it together maybe we should do it.











Sun Records, a division of Sun Entertainment Corporation is an American independent record label founded on Memphis Tennessee, which began operations on March 27, 1952.


Sun Records Rockabilly and Rockers Group

Founded in 1952 by Sam Philips, who also founded the recording studio Sun Studios at the same time. Sun Records discovered and first recorded such influential musicians as Elvis Presley, Carl Perkins, Roy Orbison, Jerry Lee Lewis and Johnny Cash. Prior to those records, Sun records concentrated on mainly recording African-American musicians, because Phillips loved rhythm and blues and wanted to bring the music to a white audience.

There were also sixteen female recording artists whose records were released on the Sun and Phillips International label. These included Barbra Pittman and the Miller Sisters.

Sun Records was sold in 1969 and since then has re-released and re-packaged compilations of Suns early artists in the Early 70's. It later introduced a rockabilly tribute singer Jimmy "Orion" Ellis in 1980, with Orion taking on the persona of Elvis Presley. Sun Records has also signed Julie Roberts to a recording contract in 2013. Sun remains mainly a re-issue label.

The music of Sun Records musicians helped lay part of the foundation of late 20th-century rock and roll and influenced many younger musicians, including the Beatles. In 2001, Paul McCartney appeared on a tribute compilation album titled Good Rockin' Tonight: The legacy of Sun Records. The 2010 tribute Million Dollar Quartet is based on the famous photograph of Carl Perkins, Johnny Cash, and Jerry Lee Lewis grouped round Elvis Presley at the piano, the night when the four joined in an impromptu jam at Sun Record's one-room sound studios, the "Million Dollar Quartet" of December 4, 1956.








Hot Rod Christmas

Feature Car The Kurtis Sports Car

This issues Ted Talk is about Ted and his dads' interest and collection of Tonka Trucks. I must admit I also have an addiction to children's toys, mine is 1/64 model cars. Hot Wheels, Matchbox and Green light models are my weakness. I pick them up at Walmart, Dollar stores and my favorite flea markets, I'm always on the lookout for a new old model to add to my collection. Sometimes I purchase more than one to share with my brother Kevin and also to give away to kids. I've been known to give hot wheels away at Halloween and when kids come to visit us including my granddaughters.

One day I was in a Dollar Store and browsing through the Match Box rack, pushing kids away from the area until their mother gives me the stink eye, came across a Kurtis Sports Car. I had never heard of such a car but bought it with the idea if it was a real historical car I would keep it otherwise it could go in my giveaway bin in my garage. I looked it up and found it was a keeper and since then I have found several other Kurtis Match Box cars for Kevin and to go into the give away bin. Here is what I found on the internet regarding the Kurtis Sports Car.

The Kurtis Sport Car (KSC) is a two-seat, aluminum-body sports car designed by Frank Kurtis and manufactured by Kurtis Kraft in 1949 and 1950. Built with numerous components (including the chassis and V8 engine) from a 1949 Ford, the KSC was built as both a production car and a kit car. It was sold at a base price of \$3,495, and with options it could cost up to \$5,000, which was approximately \$1,000 more than the then-new Jaguar XK120.

After Frank Kurtis realized that the car was not sustainable financially, largely due to production costs, he sold the KSC's manufacturing rights, along with its blueprints, parts, and tooling, to Earl "Madman" Muntz for \$200,000 in 1950. By that time, only 18 to 36 KSCs had been produced.

In August 1949, Wally Parks, founder of the National Hot Rod Association (NHRA) and co-founder of Hot Rod magazine, drove a modified KSC to 142.515 mph (229.356 km/h) on the Bonneville Salt Flats. In September 1949, that same KSC was featured on the cover of the first issue of Motor Trend. The KSC also likely inspired Harley Earl's Project Opel at General Motors (GM), which ultimately created the production Chevrolet Corvette. The KSC was additionally described as the first "true American sports car" in the 2017 Pebble Beach Concours d'Elegance program.





What' the Diff? The Ford and Mercury Flathead

Since the 50's I have heard hot rodder's talk about the flat head V8 and how many sought out the Mercury over the Ford. I did not know why but supposed it had to do with horsepower and I was correct. In 1932 Ford introduced the flat head V8 and it boasted 60 horse power, by 1953, the last

year for the flathead, it had grown to 110 horsepower. The same year Mercury flatheads produce 125 horsepower. They were both produced by Ford and al-



most look identical so what's the diff.?

You can Differentiate a Mercury Flathead from a Ford Flathead visually. The only visual method of differentiating Mercury and Ford Flatheads is to look at the front counter weight of the crankshaft. Mercury crankshafts have a longer stroke and are identified by a dimple on the top of the crankshaft counter weight.

The internals of the flatheads are differentiated by the crank-

shafts, the Ford's Crankshaft measures 3 3/4" and the Mercury crankshaft measures 4". The s oil passages in the Mercury are also larger. Both flatheads have the same piston size of 3.1875. The ford had 239 cubic inches and the Mercury was 255 cubic inches. Now this if for the 49-53 Fords and Merc's. The earlier years Mercury always offered a larger engine however in earlier models some had the same size crankshaft with a little larger bore.

FUN FLathead Facts

- The fastest flathead At an amazing speed of 302.204 m.p.h., a car powered by a supercharged 700 horsepower Ford flathead V8 holds the land speed record for its class at Bonnyville salt flats. The car was developed and driven by Ron Main of Chatsworth, California.
- Ford produced flathead 4 cylinder engines, 6 cylinder engines, V8 engines, and V12 engines for their Lincolns.
- The largest Ford flathead produced was a 337 cubic inch engine ranging from 125-154 horsepower used in their big Lincolns and large trucks.
- Stories tell of farmers bringing in their trucks powered by Mercury engines for rebuild and when they received their rebuilt engine with a new Ford crankshaft never knowing the difference. The rebuilders sold the mercury cranks to hot rod builders.




